That is kind of a mouthful to list, but it is something that I am very proud of. Being extremely involved on campus has allowed me to meet so many other students and faculty members, which has been nothing short of amazing in my first two years of undergrad.

GREEK LIFE ACADEMIC AND MEMBERSHIP RANKINGS

Phi Kappa Psi continues to set the academic standard at Vanderbilt, earning the top GPA among all fraternities with a 3.823 for Fall 2024. This performance places the chapter not only first among IFC organizations but sixth across the entire Greek system, including both sororities and fraternities. The data highlights a clear pattern of excellence, with Phi Psi outpacing the All Fraternity, All IFC, and even All Men’s GPA averages.
